Important Details:

1. You must have a Wisconsin State Park Vehicle Admission Sticker to enter the park

3. This event will be held rain or shine, dress appropriately.
4. Wear appropriate foot gear. The areas of the park we will be utilizing are kept in manicured lawn or on well-maintained paths. Walking shoes or hiking shoes/boots are recommended.
5. The tours are approximately 1 hour long and on flat surfaces. Tours begin at the parking lots nearest to the topic of the tour. Look for popup tents to meet your tour guides.
6. Bring water to keep hydrated. There is water in the park, but it is not particularly close to where the days events will be held.
7. Bring sunscreen, insect repellent and a hat. Tours in July can be hot and are in wooded areas where insects can be bothersome.
8. Take only pictures, leave only footprints! Sage advice for any outdoor adventure!
